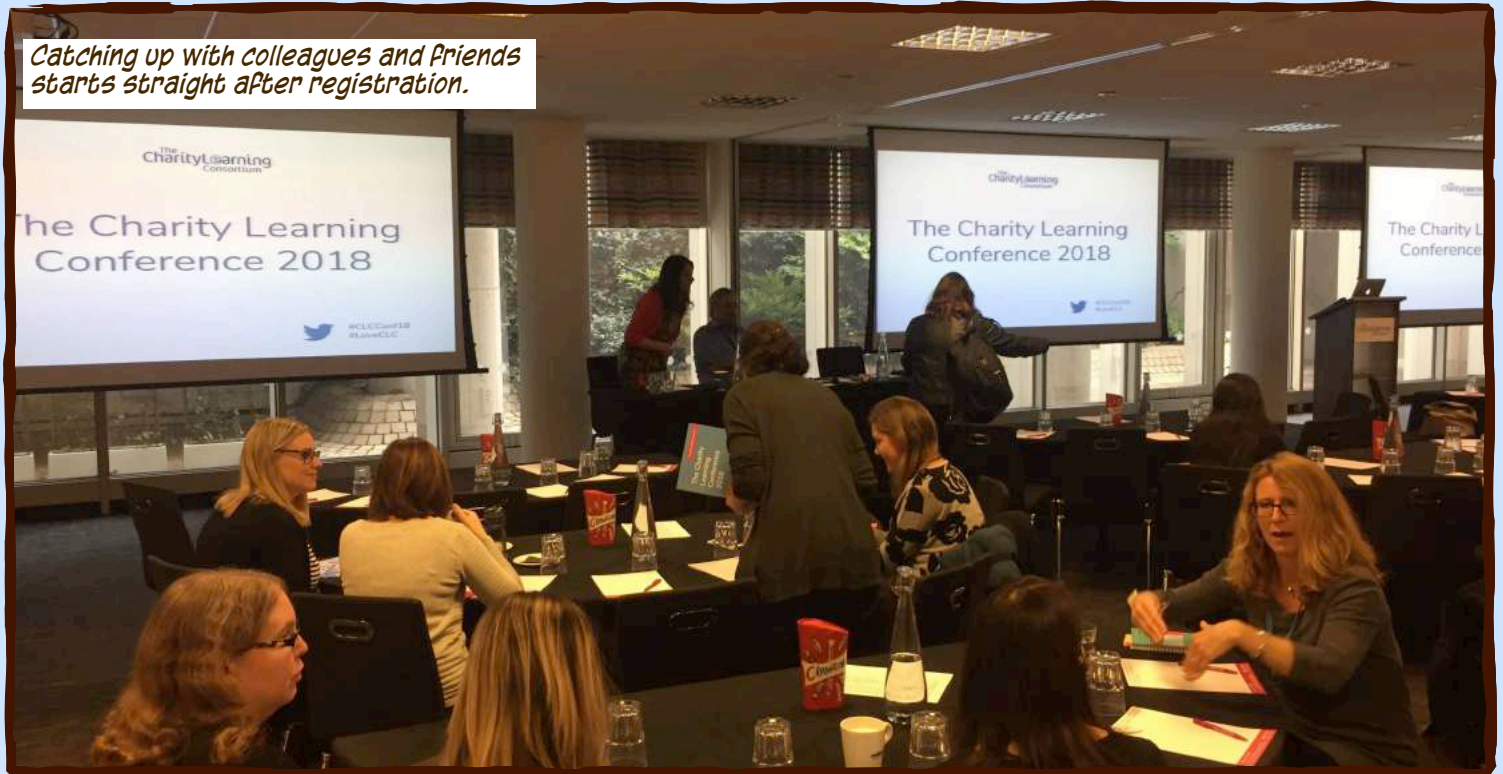


# CLC CONFERENCE 2018

Welcome to this visual summary of the CLC Conference 2018!

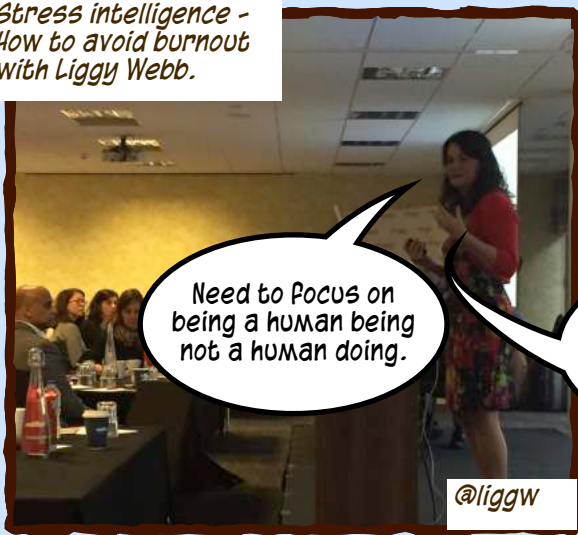


Catching up with colleagues and Friends starts straight after registration.

You can increase your happiness by taking some time out of your day to be grateful.

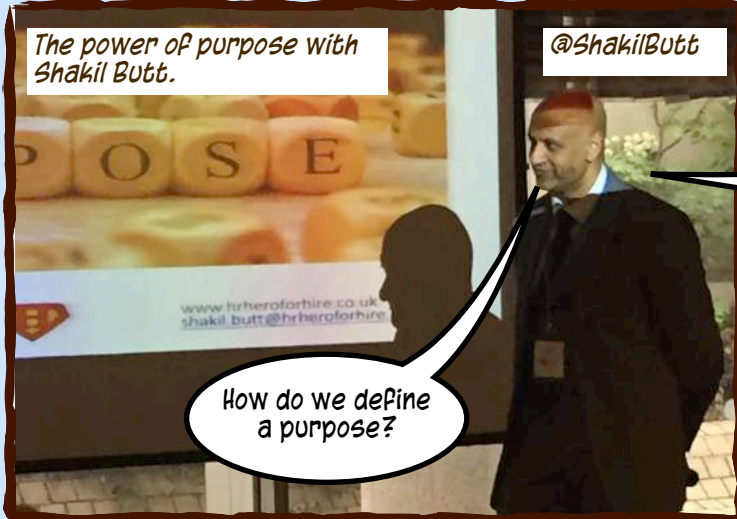

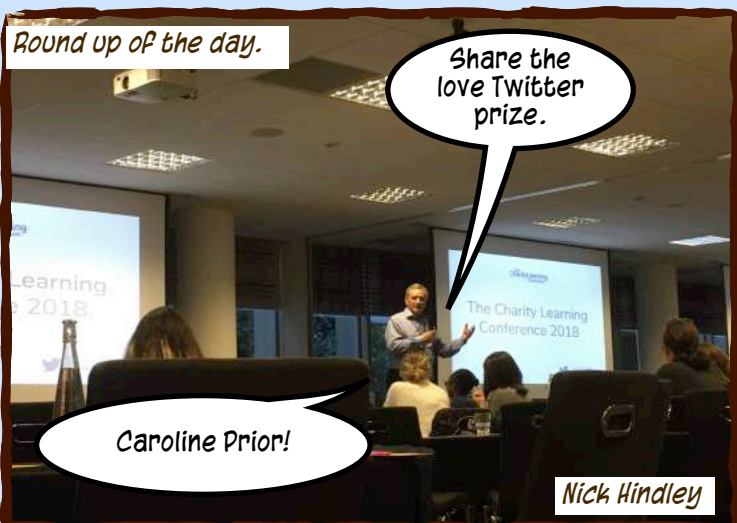
Dame Moira Gibb gave an insightful session on her own leadership in Skills For Care and how she resolved some key issues.
